# Cycling



## **Increase in RSV infections**

We are currently seeing a significant increase in the RSV virus (<u>https://www2.hse.ie/conditions/rsv</u>/), a common winter viral infection which is of particular concern for babies. Symptoms of RSV viral infections, can one or more of the following such as: a runny or blocked nose, mild fever, cough lethargy (tiredness).
