We have been working hard over the past two years on our Travel Flag. The aim of this flag is to encourage sustainable travel to and from school. Sustainable Travel includes walking, cycling, scooting, and parking further away to minimize air pollution in our school grounds. Since starting our travel flag application, we have seen a 10% increase in the number of children using sustainable methods of transport.
